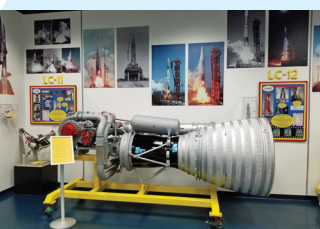
Sams House at Pine Island Conservation Area

Hike, horseback ride, fish, canoe and kayak through five different habitats and over six miles of trails and Florida’s native animals.
